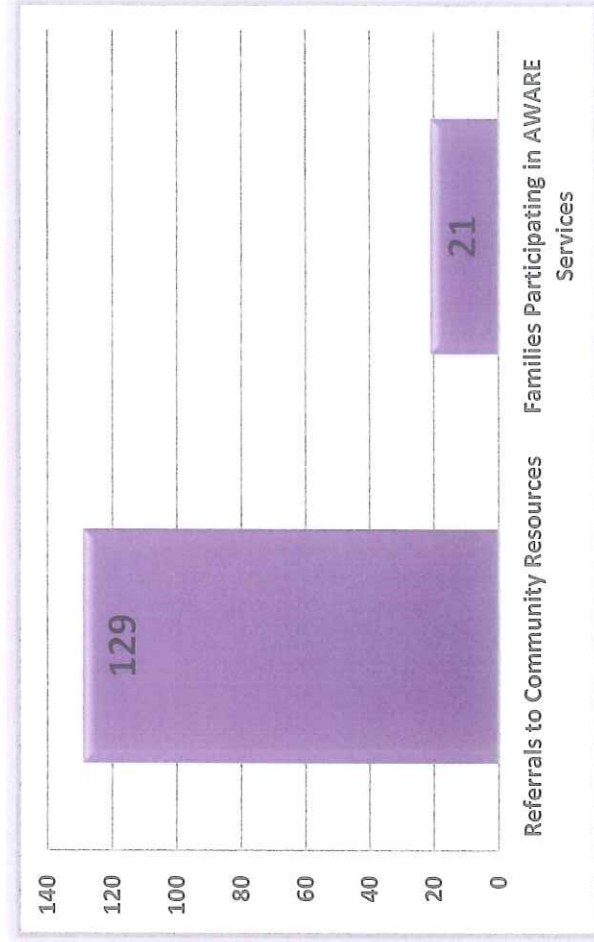
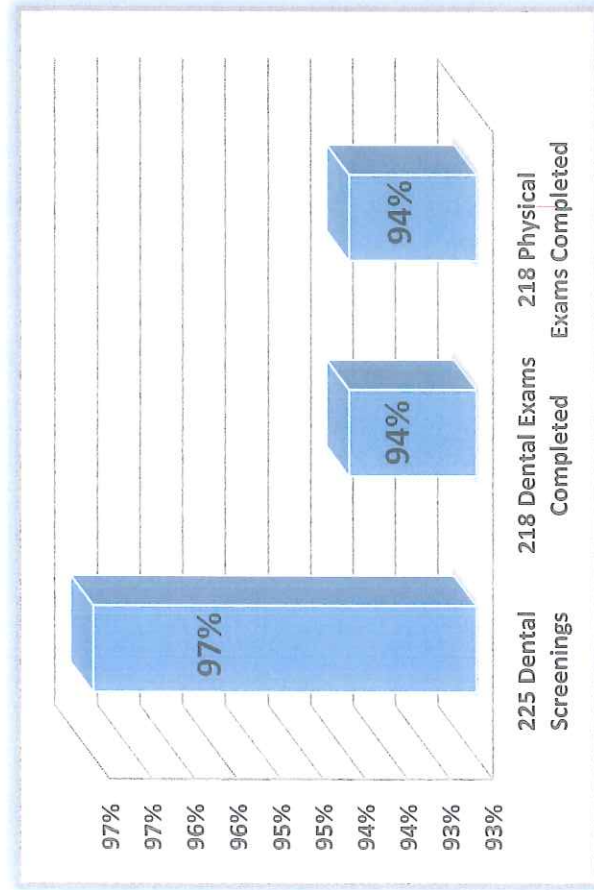

Goal: Parents will engage in one or more activities to support their child's success in school.

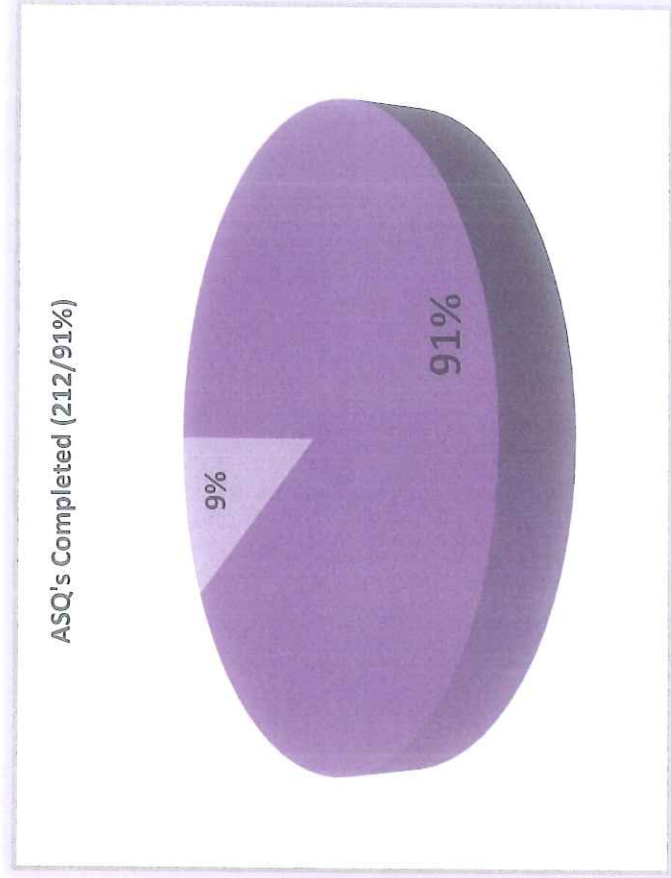
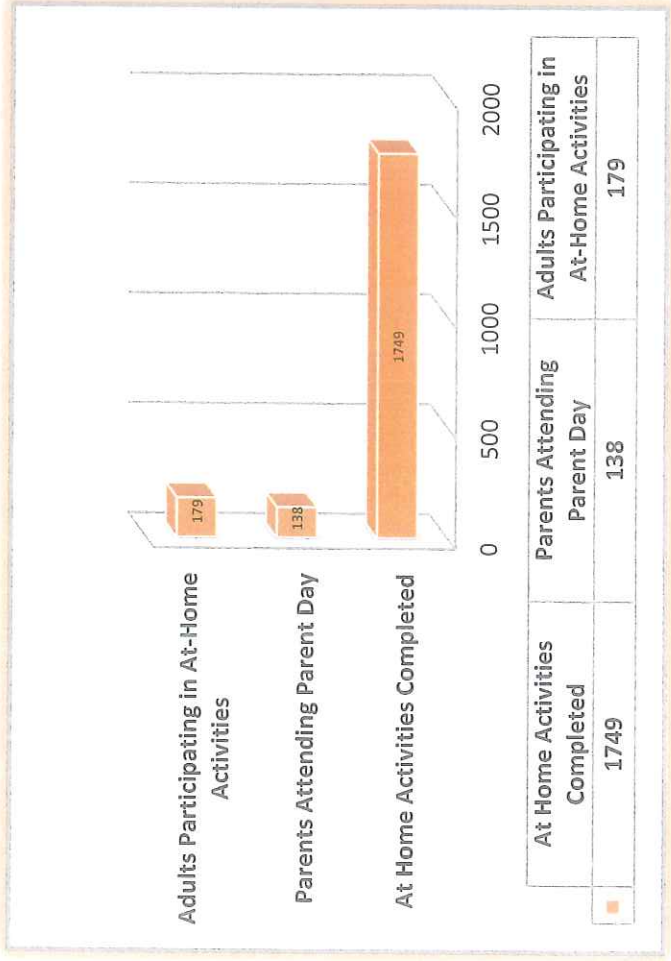

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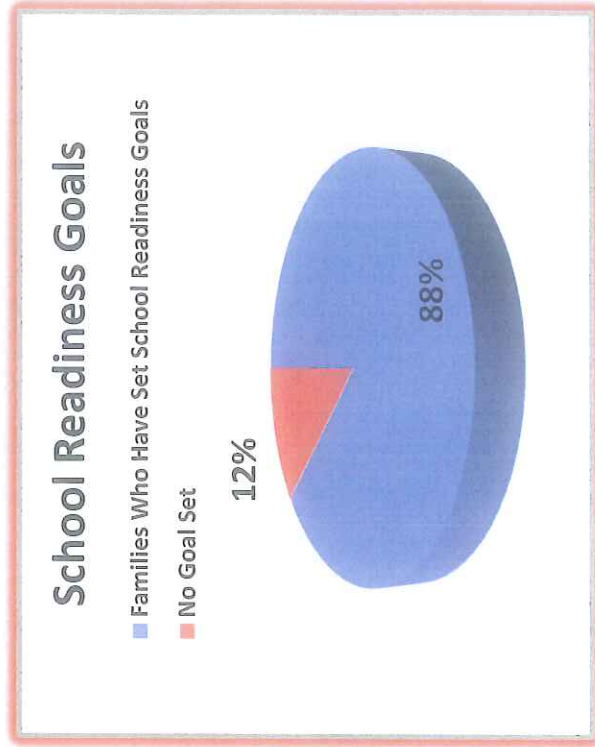
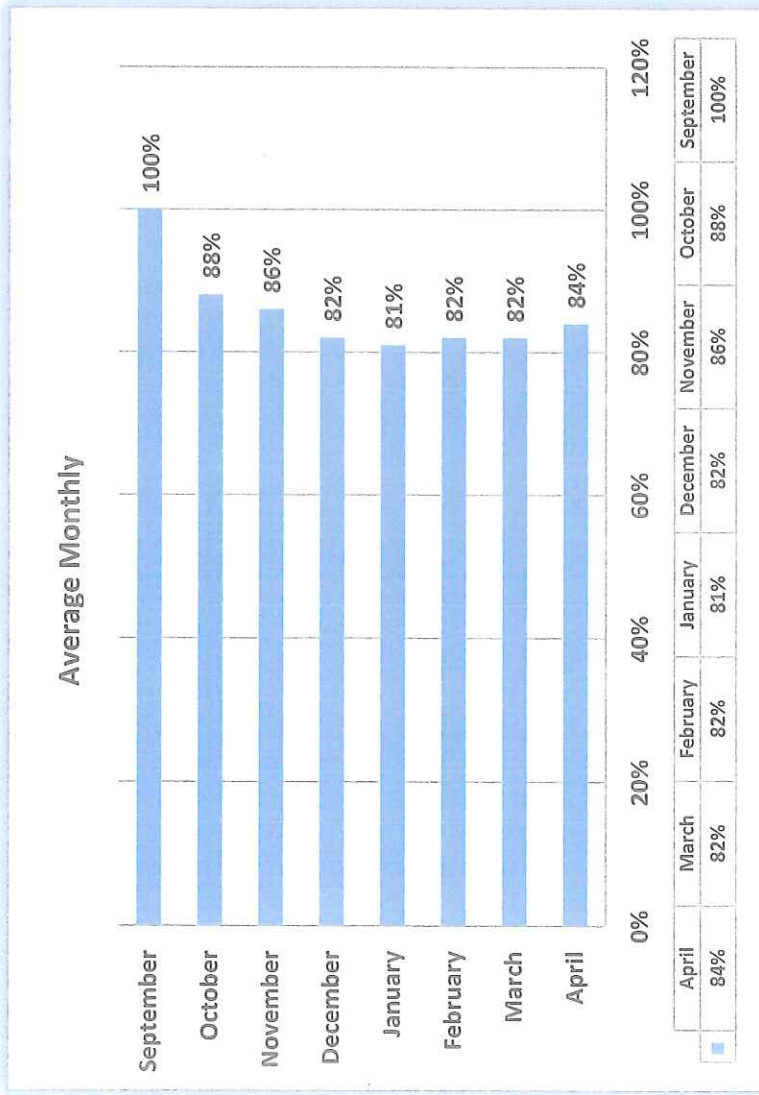
Goal #3: Families as Lifelong Educators

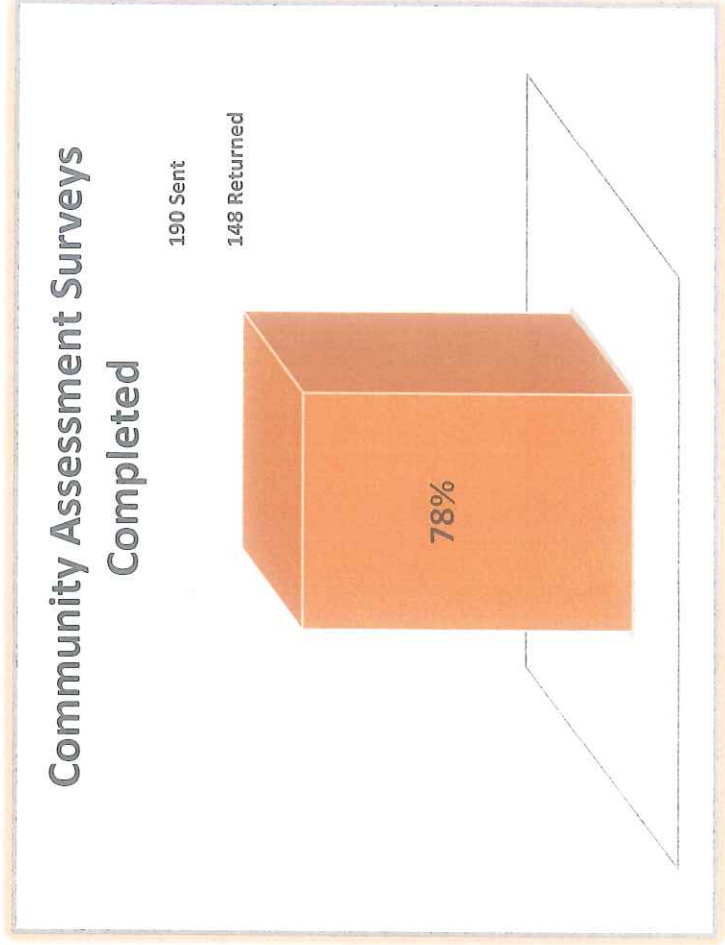
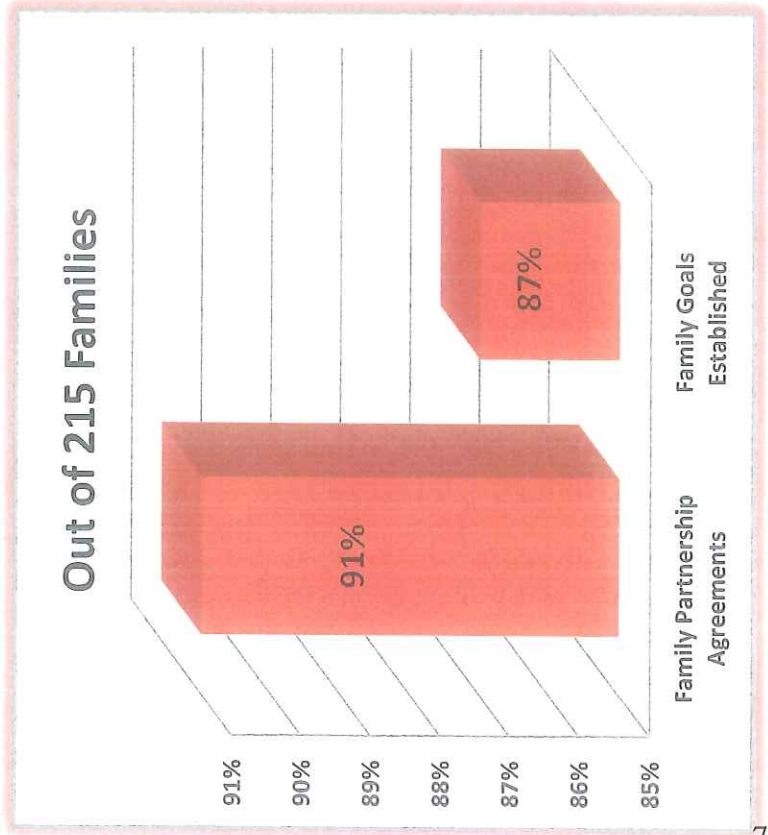
Average Monthly Attendance

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Goal #4: Families as Learners

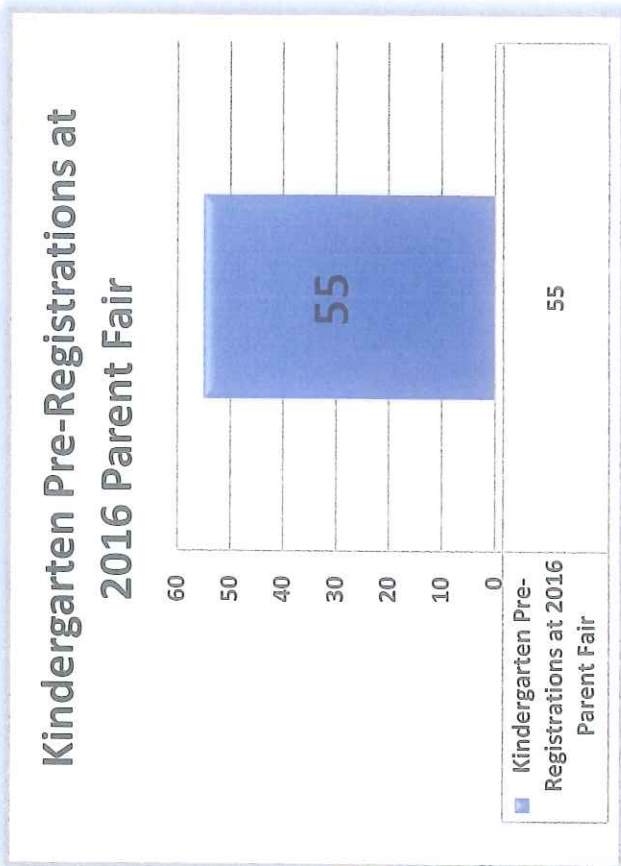
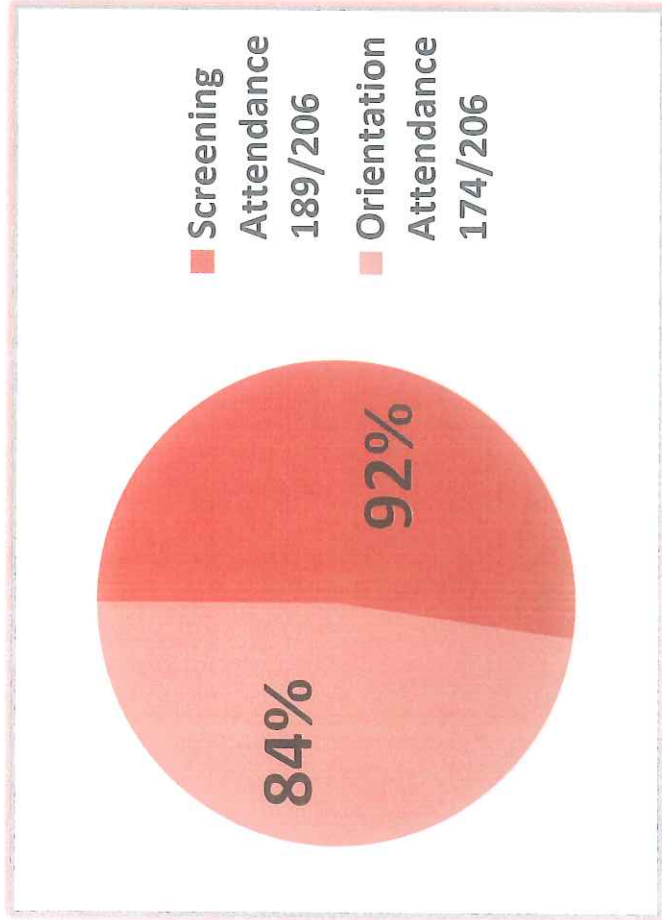

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Goal # 5: Family Engagement in Transitions

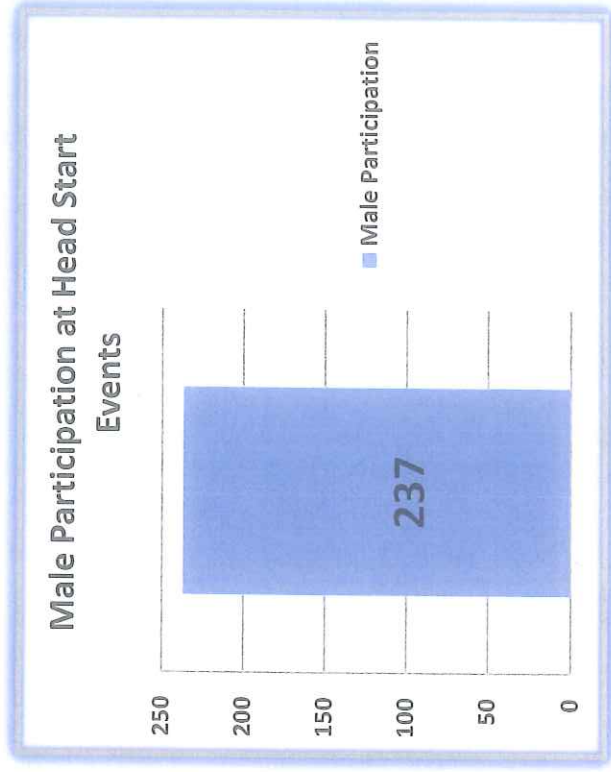
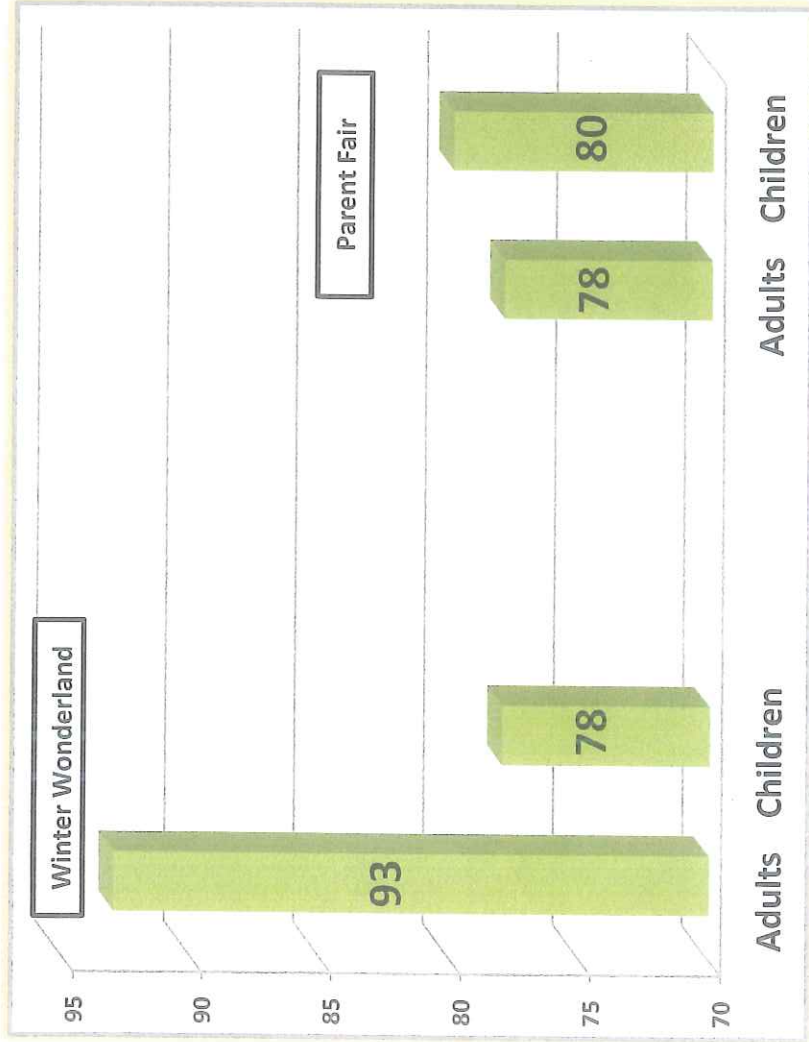
